### X-RAY REPORT

#### RIGHT BRACHIAL ANGIOGRAM:

No extracranial vascular disease changes are seen. The posterior fossa vessels appear unremarkable and there is no evidence of a posterior fossa mass.

There is an arterial aneurysm measuring approximately 6 mm. in diameter, close to the internal carotid bifurcation at the base of the skull anteriorly. As seen on an oblique view, this aneurysm arises from the proximal segment of the horizontal portion of the anterior cerebral artery. There is no major associated arterial spasm, and there is no evidence of an associated hematoma mass at this time. No other aneurysms are demonstrated.

There is no evidence of lateral ventricular dilatation.
